Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Scholarships

- VALUE:** \$1,000
- NUMBER:** Over 370 annual scholarships
- ELIGIBILITY:** Applicants for an Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Scholarship must be:
- a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident of Canada
 - an Alberta resident as defined by Student Aid Alberta
 - be registered as Alberta apprentices in trades
 - have passed their first or subsequent period apprenticeship and industry training exams
- CRITERIA:** An **Employer Recommendation** form must be completed and attached to the application or mailed separately. Applicants must also include two or three paragraphs describing themselves, including what they enjoy about their trades, why they selected careers in the trades and how the scholarship will be of benefit.

- ✓ display community spirit, leadership and **volunteerism****
- ✓ have completed the requirements for a high school diploma within Special Areas 2, 3, or 4

Selection: Selection of scholarship recipients will be made by a committee including staff members from SCHS and members of Joel's family. Recipients will be selected on the basis of their employer's recommendation, high school marks and short description of themselves. Preference will be given to applicants who display determination, dedication, a positive attitude, a willingness to learn, diligence and leadership through athletics and/or volunteerism.

You may claim your scholarship money once you have started your technical training in an approved apprenticeship program.

**ELIGIBILITY
& CRITERIA:**

You must:

- be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident and an Alberta resident, as defined by Alberta Scholarship Programs;
- have successfully completed a recognized pre-apprenticeship program. Programs must include at least four weeks (120 hours) of trades-related instruction, not including work experience components;
- submit completed grades or proof of successful completion by June 30th;
- be a registered apprentice; and
- have demonstrated financial need.

An Employer Recommendation form must be completed and attached to the application or mailed in separately by the application deadline. Your package should include one or two paragraphs describing yourself, what you learned in your pre-apprenticeship training, why you have chosen a career in the trades and how this scholarship will benefit you.

You will receive your scholarship cheque when you attend technical training.

Your attendance at the next period of technical training is confirmed by sending in the Confirmation of Enrollment Form to Alberta Scholarship Programs. They will then send you a letter detailing how and when you will receive payment.
